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School Infrastructure and Program Development Report CREAMLAND NURSERY AND PRIMARY SCHOOL- KIREKA

School Background

The school started in 2006 and serves the children of the Kireka slum where there are very few opportunities for schooling. The area is one of the poorest in Africa, being home to thousands of families from the north of Uganda displaced by the Lord's Resistance Army which ravaged that area from 1996 until very recently. Many of the refugees are Acholi women and children who were abused by these rebels before fleeing south.

In 2014 the school was adopted by **The Andrex Training and Care Organization (TATCO Uganda)**, a nonprofit organization currently operating in Central Uganda with the aim of developing the community school with both school infrastructure and school management programs. Over 700 students are registered at Creamland school which offers education from pre-kindergarten through grade 7.

TATCO Uganda and with the support from its development partner **Classrooms For Africa** since 2015 has been providing financial support to upgrade the school by building infrastructures which include classrooms, ground leveling, toilets, provision of classroom furniture and other school supplies.

School Background

Star Nursery and Primary School was started in 2008 by Ms. Nakato Mary, with the support the local community in Bukerere Village, Mukono District. Two acres of land registered to the school were donated and temporary structures built to serve as classrooms. Today over 400 students are enrolled through all the nursery - primary grades. The students come from poor and vulnerable communities.

The area where the school is located is in a rural area around 20 km north west of Kampala and 15 km north of Mukono. The area has a high illiteracy rate and few schools. In 2018, Star school was then adopted and run by **The Andtex Training and Care Organisation (TATCO Uganda)**, a local Charity Organisation which seeks to provide quality and affordable education to low-income children around the greater Kampala area.

TATCO Uganda and with the support from its development partner **Classrooms** For Africa and Global Fund For Children since 2020 has been providing financial and material support to upgrade the school by building infrastructures which include classrooms, provision of classroom furniture, parents and teacher training workshops, provision of scholastic materials and other school supplies.

School Background

Apple Junior School – Bukerere was started in 2023 by TATCO Uganda and is headed by Namiiro Susan the ECD development Officer of the organization

The center was created to ensure all children from three years through age six most of which are children of young mothers caused by the lockdown during Covid 19 to have equitable access to affordable, comprehensive, high-quality care and education to support their mental, physical and healthy development and help them achieve their full potential in school and life.

The area where the school is located is in a semi rural-urban area with a high population and mainly dominated by children. The area has a high illiteracy rate and few ECD centers to cater for the wellbeing and development of children. Through the support of our partners, TATCO Uganda started an ECD center which seeks to provide a safe environment for learners, teach learners through play, children nutrition support to children from low-income families in the area.

TATCO Uganda with support from our development partners have upgraded a leased structure and space for the school and provided scholastic materials and other school supplies.
